Notes of the meeting held on December 10th 2018

Present: 11 members were present with Louise Owen and Laura Cook from Healthwatch Sheffield in attendance. 2 two new members were welcomed.

Matters arising from previous meeting The problems with the website were aired again and it was agreed to flag up to the practice that "We are very concerned about the problems with the website and feel that professional help is required to improve it as soon as possible."

Perfect Patient Test Bed Programme Laura Cook from Healthwatch Sheffield, the local independent consumer watchdog for health and social services, had briefed HPF in September 2017 about 2 initiatives in which the Hollies practice were taking part namely the asthma exploring self-management and the falls prevention (renamed strength and balance) projects. She outlined the successes and problems which mostly concerned the need for better, cost-effective publicity for the projects including a need to re-design the Healthwatch Sheffield poster. 3 funding has been applied for to the CCG for improved soundproofing on the lower ground floor, modernisation in the attic level and self-opening doors for those in wheel chairs.

4 the practice is trying to develop a greater green impact with recycling of paper, magazines and cardboard cups.

5 the practice will be entering a team in the Endcliffe Park Run.

A member asked for the parking spaces by the pharmacy to be signed as disabled only and that taxis be discouraged from waiting there particularly with their engines running as the resulting pollution was bad for asthma sufferers.
